Background	Tangata whenua are significant stakeholders in the Opotiki District. While there are generally three lwi authorities (Whakatohea Maori Trust Board, Ngai Tai lwi Authority and Te Runanga o te Whanau) there will be occasions where hapu wish to represent themselves directly.
Purpose	To ensure Tangata Whenua are involved in Council decision making.
Policy Statement	That Council consult with the tangata whenua as required by the Resource Management Act, the Local Government Act and other legislation. In policy matters relating to the District Plan and for applications requiring Council consent, where there is a difference of opinion, all will be consulted. Council in this process will make no determinations as to which group has authority. Where there is a conflict between the views expressed and in the absence of resolution by the groups themselves, Council will deal with the matter as it best sees fit.
