If for any reason the council cannot meet the timeframe, it will inform the applicant.					
<b>Personal information:</b> personal information provided in this form and during the course of assessing this application will be used by Ōpōtiki District Council for the purpose of assessing this application and carrying out the council's duties under the Camping-Grounds Regulations 1985 and may be shared with the council's contractors or agents for these purposes. If you do not provide the information requested, the council may refuse to grant the exemption sought. The council will keep a record of this application and its decision. If an exemption is granted, the council will also record relevant information in its register of camping grounds (held under regulation 8 of the Health (Registration of Premises) Regulation 1966), which can be inspected by any employee of the Director-General of Health, Medical Officer of Health, Health Protection Officer, or an officer who has functions under an enactment administered by the Ministry of Health.
