Comments	My name is Katelyn Goldsmith and I have been privileged enough to have grown up going to Whanarua Bay. In my submissions I will be going over some large concerns with the Statement of Proposal. The first issue is having vehicular access for beachfront properties at Whanarua bay (Lot 66). I have been visiting Whanarua bay all my life as has my mother before me and have had the privilege of staying in the beachfront properties. My family own a beachfront batch and it is hoped to continue staying in the family for generations to come. I want the opportunity for my own children to have the same experience as me and enjoy the beauty of staying at the edge of a secluded beach. There is other land that could be looked into by Te Arawhiti and Te Whānau a Apanui which would not have as large an impact on the community.
