# Driver licencing

Did you know that only 5% of students leave school with a full licence? Yet a driver's licence is almost essential for almost any job in Ōpōtiki, for the mahi itself or to get legally to and from work or study.

Ōpōtiki district doesn't have great stats on our roads – we have a high crash rate and we have a lot of unlicenced drivers. But we know that it can be really difficult to get a driver's licence in our rohe – a road-worthy car, someone to teach you to drive, distance to a testing centre, and all sorts of other barriers.

In the Eastern Bay, that means fewer and fewer people are getting their licence which is not helping safety on our roads or helping people into work or study.

## What are we doing?

Since 2017, council has supported locally-led initiatives to help our community "get legal" and drive more competently. We've got several great programmes to make it easier and support people to get their Learner, Restricted or Full Licence.

# **Öpötiki Community Driver Mentoring Programme**

We've partnered with and funded Eastbay REAP to help people progress from Learner to Restricted (which is probably the hardest step in the process!) and then from Restricted to Full. So far, we have helped 248 people do just that! You can visit or call the Heartlands Office on Church St to find out more about this awesome programme.

#### Supporting Learner and **Restricted Licencina**

We've partnered with and funded other local providers and organisations to help people take the first step to get their Learner Licence. We've also worked with Mary-Lou's Driving School to bring Defensive Driving Courses to Ōpōtiki. These courses reduce the time before you are able to sit your Full Licence by six months and help build confidence and skills for Restricted licence holders.


### Öpötiki College helps their students as part of their school programmes
