Via our MTfJ national partnership, we're working with EMA, and can offer a special package of mentoring, training and unlimited helpline support to employers who've joined our MTfJ scheme. We're also supporting some new one-day training sessions for all of our local businesses and are keen to hear from anyone interested!

Practical ways we can help

- If you employ someone who was previously unemployed, only employed seasonally or very part ٠ time, we can help out with small grants to support these new employees. This is a partnership with the Ministry for Social Development and the Mayors' Taskforce for Jobs and the funds can help with up-skilling, tools, PPE or, in some cases, as a wage subsidy. So far 30 employers have joined this programme, and 96 new recruits have benefitted.
- We help new employees gain their Class 1 Drivers Licence.
- We also find out about common tickets and training needed by our local employers and work with training providers to bring those programmes to Opotiki to make attendance easier.
